# PRESIDENTS REPORT



This year saw a significant evolution in the governance of Macquarie Home Stay with major change to Board Membership. Since 2011 the same team has overseen the development of Macquarie Home Stay from their initial shared understanding of a need to help mitigate some difficulties experienced by guests from beyond Dubbo as they accessed health services in Dubbo to the current thriving accommodation complex that is fulfilling that purpose for many. At the end of last year Elizabeth Allen, Lorna White and Nola Honeysett retired from the Macquarie Home Stay Ltd Board and I would like to acknowledge their commitment and contributions to the journey of realising that dream.

After consideration of what skills and attributes would enhance the capacity of the Board to meet the challenges of the next few years, expressions of interest for membership were invited through public advertisement. We were gratified to experience strong interest in joining us and on the basis of our skill mix, we selected to welcome Sharon Portelli, Pip Job, Tom Toohey, Ailsa Graham, Trudy Behsman and Steve Guy to join the remaining 'originals' - Rod Crowfoot, Ray Nolan, Fiona Prentice and myself. This team has met monthly to support the development of Macquarie Home Stay, albeit virtually in recent months in recognition of COVID restrictions. We are in the process of establishing an agreed comprehensive policy base for the operation and strategically planning the next few years' developmental activity.

During the year we unfortunately farewelled Tom who found it

difficult to fit MHS with his other commitments. We thank Tom for his willingness to support MHS through Board membership and wish him well.

I would like to thank Rod and his staff team for their consistent great work, day to day. Apart from the implicit challenges of continuing to develop a very young business, COVID-19 has added a totally unexpected layer of challenge. I congratulate all on the conscientious manner in which they have implemented the necessary changes to their work practices and the positivity they have shown in the face of adversity. It is sincerely appreciated by the Board as well as by our very grateful clients - who delightfully share accounts of their stay with their friends and acquaintances and so provide one of our strongest sources of new bookings.

The occupancy rates experienced throughout the year have continued to demonstrate that the need we thought existed was definitely both real and ongoing, and we look forward eagerly to the day we can source sufficient finance to expand the facility to meet the evident demand for which planning is now well advanced.

I thank fellow Board members for their continued commitment to Macquarie Home Stay Ltd and its ongoing provision of a much needed service to our fellow citizens of North Western NSW, and look forward to another year of growth and development.

The list would be too long to name the donors individually, but can I take this opportunity to say a very heartfelt thankyou from us and on behalf of our guests who wish to express their sincere appreciation for the kindness and generosity shown to them.

During the course of the year, our community dinners have been a welcomed distraction and an opportunity for social connections with other guests over a hearty meal. Sadly, as a result of Covid the format of these have had to change however the Rotary Club of Dubbo West, Rotary Club of Macquarie, Rotary Club of Dubbo South, Rotary Club of Dubbo and the Pink Angels have typically provided a wonderful menu of food once a month each, meaning our guests don't have to worry about cooking that night. Not only is the meal a way to help support the guests with a nourishing

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meal its also an opportunity of meeting other mums to be, patients having similar treatments and so on.

I wish to acknowledge the support we have received this year from the health practitioners in Dubbo and farther afield. Doctors, nurses, administration staff, social workers, midwives and more who actively promote our existence to patients. As a result, more people are aware of us and are able to take advantage of the services and support we provide. This is an important partnership we have with the Local Health District, and our thanks goes to them for your encouragement and support.

We have taken the time this year to listen to our guests, ask the questions and get clarity on what we do well, what needs changing and as we grow what do we need to do to add to our accommodation



mix and design so it best meets the needs of our community. This has been a very worthwhile experience, and is allowing us to make important changes to the masterplan so it best meets the needs of individuals, couples and families who stay with us. An example we have identified that nearly one third of all our guests who stay here do so as 1 person only, so providing single occupant rooms into the future is a wise inclusion.

To this end, we have been actively promoting the value that Home Stay offers to all levels of Government, philanthropic organisations, community groups, business and individuals encouraging them to continue to partner with us as we pursue our expansion plans. We have been truly touched this year with the donations that have been made to us. Large and small, regular and one off, they all have a positive

We have big plans for our future, however need support from all areas to help this become a reality. We propose that our next stage of accommodation to be built will be to support the patients whilst receiving their treatment at the Western Cancer Centre. This is a wonderful addition to the treatment options at the redeveloped Dubbo Hospital.

One guest recently passed the comment 'Home Stay is like all the other motels, its got 4 walls and a roof, but when I stay here I just feel better'. This in part is to do with the physical environment we provide, but a large part is the people they engage with when they arrive or during their stay. For us that's a huge compliment, and our team, weather it be the girls in the office, our housekeepers they see daily or our gardener, they do all they can to make our guests feel welcome and comfortable.

We have had the great privilege of meeting hundreds of patients who, with their support team, have spent either a small amount or a long time away from home. They have shared with us their joys, and also their sadness, and our lives are richer for the experience. We look forward to each day and what it brings.






### **TOWN OF RESIDENCE**




### TREATMENT TYPE

We have had our first full year of operation which has had its challenges. We have finished the financial year in a good financial position, with good systems in place to continue to support us into the future.

COVID-19 has presented its challenges with reduced income due to hospitals shutting down elective surgery and people staying for shorter periods of time. It has increased our costs particularly cleaning and maintaining the facility during this time. This downturn has allowed us to qualify for Jobkeeper for 6


months helping us to work through these challenges without it being a financial burden.

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




What we have learnt this past year from our guests, community and health practitioners has equipped us to make informed and appropriate adjustments to our master plan accommodation offering and that has been exciting.
